## Gauge/Tension

26 sts and 51 rows to measure $10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}$ over g st using 3.25 mm needles

## Measurements

Cube measures $14.5 \times 14.5 \times 14.5 \mathrm{~cm}$
Approx. 18cm tall (including Bow)

## Abbreviations

[] number of stitches on a given row
cont continue
g st garter stitch: knit all rows
k knit
k2tog knit 2 sts together to decrease by 1 st
kfb knit into the front and back of st to increase

## Pattern Notes

Doorstop cube is made in six separate pieces, joined together. Weighted bag of pellets and stuffing are added before final seams are worked. Ribbons and Bow are worked separately. G st is used throughout. Break yarn after each colour change.

## Instructions

CUBE FACE (MAKE 6)
Using Yarn C, cast on 2 sts.
Increase Section
Row 1 (WS) (Kfb) twice. [4 sts]
Row 2 (RS) Knit.
Row 3 K1, (kfb) twice, k1. [6 sts]
Row 4 Knit.

Row $5 \mathrm{K1}$, kfb, k to last 2 sts, kfb, k1. [8 sts] Change to Yarn A.
Cont working ing st. Alternate between Yarns A, C and D for stripes: work four-row sections of Varns C and D with two-row sections of Yarn A between them.
Rows 6-51 Rep Rows 4-5. [54 sts] Decrease Section
Row 52 Knit.
Row 53 K1, k2tog, kto last 3sts, k2tog, k1. [52 sts]
Rows 54-99 Rep Rows 52-53. [6 sts]
Cont using Yarn C only.
Row 100 Knit.
Row 101 K1, (k2tog) twice, k1. [4 sts]
Row 102 Knit.
Row 103 (K2tog) twice. [2 sts]
Break yarn, thread through rem sts, pull tight and fasten off.

## RIBBON (MAKE 2)

Using Yarn B, cast on 6 sts.
Work in g st until piece measures 50 cm from cast-on edge. Cast off.
Using Yarn B, oversew cast-on and cast-offedges together, keeping the seam flat.

## BOW

## Main Piece

Using Yarn B, cast on 19 sts.
Work in gst until piece measures 43 cm from cast-on edge. Cast off.
Using Yarn B, oversew cast-on and cast-off edges flat.

## Centre

Using Yarn B, cast on 6sts.
Work in g st until piece measures 6.5 cm from
cast-on edge. Cast off.
Using Yarn B, oversew cast-on and cast-off edges flat.

## Ends

Using Yarn B, make a slip knot on needle.
Row 1 (RS) Kfb. [2 sts]
Row 2 (WS) Knit.
Row 3 Kfb, kto end. [3sts]
Rows 4-35 Rep Rows 2-3. [19 sts]
Rows 36-74 Knit.
Row 75 K2tog, kto end. [18 sts]
Row 76 Knit.
Rows 77-108 Rep Rows 75-76. [2 sts]
Row 109 K2tog. [1 st]
Break yarn, thread through rem st, pull tight and fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Use photo as a guide. Block pieces to measurements.

## Cube

Lay five Cube Faces on flat surface with RS facing you according to Schematic: Cube Layout. Match stripe colours at edges for 'V' effect shown in photo. Using Yarn D, mattress stitch one edge of each side piece to adjacent edge of bottom piece. Flip work so WS is now facing. Fold sides 1 and 2 up until edges meet (WS will be on inside) and, with RS facing you, mattress stitch them together. Rep for all rem edges.
Cut six $14 \times 14$ cm squares from Creative Sheet. Round off corners to prevent them poking through fabric. Place one square flat on bottom inside cube, place one square against each side. Place weighted bag inside cube and cover with stuffing.

Place sixth piece of sheet on top of stuffing, cover with sixth Cube Face, matching colour stripes at edges in same way as previously. Mattress stitch edges together, adding extra stuffing before closing last seam as needed. Weave in all ends.

## Ribbons and Bow

Stretch Ribbons around Cube, crossing at top and bottom.
Cut 30 cm length of Yarn B. Lay Main Piece of Bow flat, wrap yarn firmly around centre to hold in 'bow' shape. Slip Bow Centre over Bow and position to cover wrapped centre of Main Piece.
With sloping edge of Bow Ends at top, carefully thread through Bow Centre. Stitch back of Bow Centre to top of Cube, passing through Bow Ends to secure.

## TO FINISH

Weave in rem ends.

## Gauge/Tension

11 sts and 15 rounds to measure $10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}$ over dc using an 8 mm hook

## Measurements

Approx. 15cm diameter, 13 cm height

## Abbreviations (UK Terms)

[ ] number of sts on a given round/row beg beginning
blo back loop(s) only: insert hook under back loop(s) only
ch(s) chain(s) or chain stitch(es)
dc double crochet
htr half treble crochet
mr magic ring

## Pattern Notes

Tub, Antlers and Ears are worked using amigurumi method (work in a spiral without closing each round with ss) and using double stranded yarn (two strands of yarn held together; crochet with both).

When changing colours for stripes, do not fasten off unused yarn but strand it across back of work. Change colour in last yoh of previous st.

## Instructions

## TUB

Using 8 mm hook and Yarn A held double, make mr.
Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st), 6dc into mr, change to Yarn B. [6 dc]
Round 2 (RS) Using Yarn B, (2dc in next st)
6 times, change to Yarn A. [12 dc]
Continue to alternate Yarns A and B in same way.
Round 3 Using Yarn A, (1dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [18 dc]
Round 4 Using Yarn B, (2dc, 2dc in nextst) 6 times. [24 dc]
Round 5 Using Yarn A, (3dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [30 dc]
Round 6 Using Yarn B, (4dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [36 dc]
Round 7 Using Yarn A, (5dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [42 dc]
Round 8 Using Yarn B, (6dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [48 dc]
Round 9 Using Yarn A, (7dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [54 dc]
Round 10 Using Yarn B, (8dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [60 dc]
Round 11 Using Yarn A, 60dc blo.
Round 12 Using Yarn B, 60dc.
Round 13 Using Yarn A, 60dc.
Rounds 14-29 Rep Rounds 12-13, fasten off Yarn B.
Round 30 Using Yarn A, 60ss blo. [60 ss blo] Fasten off Varn A.

## ANTLER (MAKE 2)

Split Yarn C into 2 balls.
Using 8mm hook and Yarn C held double, ch7.
Row 1 (RS) 1dc in second ch from hook, 5dc, ch6, working in ch-6 just made, 1dc in second ch from hook, 4dc, 1ss in first ch of beg ch-7, ch6, working in ch-6 just made, 1dc in second ch from hook, 4dc, 1ss in same ch as previous ss. [16 dc] Fasten off.

## EAR (MAKE 2)

Using 8mm hook and Yarn B, ch8.
Round 1 (RS) Beg in second ch from hook, *1ss, 1dc, 1htr, 1tr, 1htr, 1dc, 1ss; rep from * once more along other side of beg ch-8, change to Yarn A, fasten off Yarn B. [14 sts]
Row 2 (RS) Using Yarn A, 14ss blo. [14 ss blo]
Fasten off.

## ASSEMBLY

Use photo as a guide.
Stitch Ears to top edge of Tub 13 sts apart, stitch Antlers evenly between Ears, then stitch buttons to Tub below Antlers, over Round 23, 3 sts apart.
Make a pompom using Yarn D and attach in centre of Tub below button eyes over Round 18.

## TO FINISH

Weave in all ends.

## punch needie tree decorations

## Measurements

Approx. $10 \times 7 \mathrm{~cm}$

## Abbreviations

RS right side
st(s) stitch(es)
WS wrong side

## Pattern Notes

Materials in Shopping List are enough to make three Decorations shown in photo.
Decorations are made using punch needle technique and finished with felt backing and hanging loop. Worksts from WS to create looped effect on RS (schematic is mirrored).
Use largest punch needle attachment from set for this project (item PN-103). Tool has adjustable st length to set size of loops; st lengths for sections are indicated on schematic. Always hold yarn loosely over your hand while punch needling, ensuring no tension. When there is tension, loops can come out as you work. Insert needle through fabric as far as possible and carefully remove, keeping needle tip on surface of fabric.

## Instructions

## PREPARE FABRIC

Step 1 Cut Evenweave fabric into three 25 cm squares. Tape schematic to window or light box, position fabric on top with images in centre and trace.

## PUNCH NEEDLING

Refer to corresponding schematics on page 10 for colour placement and st lengths.

## Tree

Step 2 Clamp fabric into hoop with traced design on top and screw tightly to secure, making sure image is not distorted. Work Yarn A sections by outlining shape then filling in, working around edges towards centre. Once all Yarn A sections are worked, snip yarn between sections. Work Yarn B sections in similar way, then work pot using Yarn D . Outline with two rows of Yarn E. Remove work from hoop.

## Bauble

Step 3 Clamp work into hoop, and working in a similar way to Step 2, fill Yarn C sections, then Yarn D, then Yarn E. Outline with two rows of Yarn B. Remove work from hoop.

## Candy Cane

Step 4 Clamp work into hoop and work in a similar way to Steps $2-3$. When outlining, also fill in area between tip of Candy Cane and bow, and area inside ribbon loops. Remove work from hoop.

## SHAPE DECORATIONS

Step 5 Cut around shapes leaving 1.5 cm border and fold Evenweave to WS. Snip around curves and into corners where needed. Spread glue across back of whole shape to secure loops and hold down Evenweave. Leave to dry.

## DECK THE HALLS WITH PUNCH NEEOLNG

There's more to these stripy Christmas tree decorations than meets the eye! Skip adding hanging loops and backing and glue the designs to the front of handmade Christmas cards, or punch the designs directly onto a square of woven fabric and make a fun set of festive cushions.

## HANGING LOOP (MAKE 3)

Step 6 Cut 30cm lengths of Yarns B, D and E. Knot strands together at one end. Secure knot to a surface with tape or safety pin to help keep tension and make a 20cm 3-strand braid. Knot end and trim.

## BACKING

Step 7 Place tree onto purple felt, draw around shape and cut out. Repeat for bauble and candy cane with light green felt.

Step 8 Place each decoration WS up and position matching felt backing on top. Fold hanging loops in half and tuck knotted ends between layers at top of each decoration. Whip st backings to decorations with matching sewing thread, making sure sts pass through braid to secure.

12 sts and 6 rows to measure $10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}$ over htr using a 3 mm hook

Measurements
15 cm high
15 cm wide

dc2tog
htr half treble crochet
htr2tog half treble crochet 2 sts tog to decrease by 1 st: (yoh, insert hook in next st, yoh, pull up Ip) twice, yoh, draw through all Ips

RS right side ss slip stitch(es) st(s) stitch(es) yoh yarn over hook (.......) x times work instructions between brackets the total number of times stated

Special Abbreviation standing htr standing half treble crochet: make slip knot on hook, insert hook in st from front to back while holding slip knot in place with index finger, yoh, pull Ip through to front and up to working height, flip yarn tail out of way, yoh, draw through both Ips on hook

## Pattern Notes

Two identical Star pieces are made and then stitched together. Each Star piece begins with five joined rounds, then five Points are worked in rows without turning (RS stays facing throughout).
Edging is added at end of section to outline Star shape.
First htr of each Round/Row is made using standing htr (see Special Abbreviation); to change colour, fasten off at the end of Round/Row, then join new yarn by working a standing htr in first st of new Round/Row.
Sequins are added once Star is assembled.

## Instructions

## STAR (MAKE 2)

## Centre

Using Yarn A, make magic ring.
Round 1 (RS) 1Ohtr into ring, ss to first htr to join,
fasten off. [10 htr]
Round 2 (RS) Using Yarn B, 2htr in each st around, ss to first htr, fasten off. [20 htr]
Round 3 Using Yarn C, (1htr, 2htr in next st) 10 times, ss to first htr, fasten off. [30 htr]
Round 4 Using Yarn D, (2htr, 2htr in next st) 10 times, ss to first htr, fasten off. [40 htr]
Round 5 Using Yarn E, (3htr, 2htr in next st) 10 times, ss to first htr, fasten off. [50 htr] Continue to work five Points, do not turn after each row.

## Points

Row 6 (RS) Using Yarn F, 10htr, fasten off. [10 htr]
Row 7 (RS) Using Yarn G, htr2tog, 6htr, htr2tog, fasten off. [8 htr]

Row 8 Using Yarn H, htr2tog, 4htr, htr2tog, fasten off. [6 htr]
Row 9 Using Yarn I, htr2tog, 2htr, htr2tog, fasten off. [4 htr]
Row 10 Using Yarn A, htr2tog, htr2tog, fasten off. [2 htr]
Beginning in next unworked st of Round 5 of Centre, rep Rows 6-10 a further 4 times, fasten off. [5Points made]

## Edging

Join Yarn D with ss to first st of any Row 10, ch1 (does not count as st), work around first Point: (2dc in next st) twice, 1dc in side post of Row 10, 2dc in each side post of Rows $9-7$, 1dc in side post of Row 6, dc2tog over side post of Row 6 and htr of Round 5, dc2tog over htr of Round 5 and side post of Row 6, 1dc in side post of Row 6, 2dc in each side post of Rows 7-9, 1dc in side post of Row 10; rep for remaining four Points, ss to first st to join. [115 dc] Fasten off and weave in all ends.

## ASSEMBLY

Take both Star pieces and place them together, with RS facing outwards at front and back. Using Yarn D, whip st pieces together, leaving small opening for stuffing. Stuff lightly so no fibres show through sts, then stitch on sequins at regular intervals, using invisible thread and photos as a guide: approx. $1 \times$ sequin at centre, $7 \times$ sequins on Round $3,12 \times$ sequins on Round $5,10 x$ sequins on Round 7 and $5 \times$ sequins on Round 9 .

## TO FINSH

Weave in remaining ends.

## 'II's cold

Simple striper in stocking stitch, made

strands of yarn held together; knit with both) in st st.
Alternate Yarns B and C in Stripe Section, working 6 rows per stripe.
For Adult Hat, split third ball of Yarns B and C into two balls of equal size.

## HaT

Using 9mm needles and Yarn A, cast on 44 (64) sts.
Work 6 (8) rows in g st.

## Stripe Section

Alternate Yarns B and C for stripes; work 6 rows per stripe. First stripe is worked in Yarn B. Using 6.5 mm needles and beg with ak row, work 18 (24) rows in st st.

## Child size only

Cont with stripe sequence as set.
Next row (RS) K10, k2tog, (k8, k2tog) twice,
k10, k2tog. [40 sts]
Beg with a p row, work 5 rows in st st.

## All sizes

Cont with stripe sequence as set.
Next row (RS) (K6, k2tog) 5 (8) times.
[35 (56) sts]
Beg with a p row, work 11 rows in st st.
Next row (K5, k2tog) 5 (8) times. [30 (48) sts]
Beg with a p row, work 11 rows in st st.
Next row (K4, k2tog) 5 (8) times. [25 (40) sts]
Beg with a p row, work 11 rows in st st.
Next row (K3, k2tog) 5 (8) times. [20 (32) sts]
Beg with a p row, work 11 rows in st st.
Next row (K2, k2tog) 5 (8) times. [15 (24) sts]

Beg with a p row, work 11 rows in stst. Next row (K1, k2tog) 5 (8) times. [10 (16) sts]
Beg with a p row, work 11 rows in stst. Next row (K2tog) 5 (8) times. [5 (8) sts] Beg with a p row, work 11 rows in stst. Break yarn, leaving long tail for closing end. Thread tail through remaining sts and pull tight to fasten.

## TO FINISH

Weave in all ends. Using mattress stitch, join row ends, carefully matching stripes for an even finish. Using Yarn A, make a 7 (10)cm pompom, stitch securely to top of Hat.

## ELF STOCKINGS

## Measurements

$45 \times 25 \mathrm{~cm}$

## Pattern Notes

Materials are to make both Stockings; one in each colourway shown in photos. First Stocking is made with green stripes, and Second Stocking with red stripes. 3 mm -thick white felt is specified to give sufficient structure to Stocking Front and Stocking Back. 2 mm red and green felt is used to decorate Stocking Front so it does not need to be as thick. Boot Cuff is interlined to allow for weight of bells. Yarn is used for embroidery and to hand stitch pieces tog. Size 22 chenille needle is recommended for all stitching. ## FIRST STOCKING

## Prepare Fabric

Step 1 Using Schematic: Cutting Template, trace
Stocking Fronts and Backs onto white felt then cut out. Using cut-out piece as guide for shape and green felt, cut out one Boot and four Stripes measuring 20 x 3 cm . From red felt, cut two 20 cm squares which will
form Boot Cuff and Stocking Cuff. From interlining, cutan 18 cm square (used in Step 4).

## Assemble Stocking Front

Step 2 Position Boot on Stocking Front and tack in place. It will overhang cut edge slightly to disguise white felt behind.
Step 3 Starting 1cm above Boot on inner edge, pin Stripes diagonally across leg of Stocking Front 3cm apart. Turn Stocking Front over and trim overhang in line with edges. Sew running stitch along both long edges of each Stripe to secure. Step 4 Trace Boot Cuff onto bottom half of interlining. Fuse interlining square to centre of 20 cm red felt square following manufacturer's instructions. Fold and pin felt RS tog and cut out two Boot Cuffs following traced lines. Pin WS tog (carefully check which side should face outwards) and sew running stitch all around edge of Boot Cuff. Position top of Boot Cuff 1cm above top of Boot and sew row of parallel running stitches along top edge of Cuff to attach.
Step 5 Fold 20cm square of red felt in half and lay on flat surface. Place top of Stocking Front 1cm below fold and trim the vertical edges of Stocking Cuff parallel so they overhang by 0.5 cm on either side.
Step 6 Write or print name to fit an area roughly $5 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}$. Trace onto tissue paper and pin to front layer of Stocking Cuff with name positioned centrally under fold. Use stem stitch to embroider name, stitching through front layer of felt only. Gently tear away tissue paper and use pin to remove any remaining tissue under stitches. Step 7 Position and pin back layer of Stocking Cuff so that fold is 1 cm above top of Stocking Front and both vertical edges parallel. Sew a running

20 cm square piece of tissue paper Basic hand sewing kit + iron
stitch under the fold to attach back layer only to Stocking Front.

## Assemble Stocking Back

Step 8 Fold 6mm green ribbon in half to create a loop for hanging. Position cut ends on Stocking Back and whip stitch around edges of ribbon to attach.

## Join Stocking Front and Stocking Back

Step 9 Pin or clip Stocking Front to Stocking Back. Sew running stitches around sides and Boot so only top is left open. Sew through bottom layer only of Stocking Cuff. Sew under Boot Cuff.

## Attach Bells

Step 10 Stitch one 13 mm bell on each of the four points of the Boot Cuff.
Step 11 Cut 42cm length of 6mm green ribbon
and thread through 48 mm bell. Cut 33 cm length 6 mm red ribbon and thread through 40mm bell. Place red ribbon loop on top of green ribbon loop with cut ends aligned. Position cut ends under fold of Stocking Cuff with edge of ribbon aligned with outer edge of Stocking Cuff and stitch to bottom layer only of Stocking Cuff.

## Complete Stocking Cuff

Step 12 Blanket stitch around vertical sides and bottom edge of Stocking Cuff.

## SECOND STOCKING

Repeat Steps 1-12, swapping red materials with green and vice versa throughout.

## TO FINISH

Remove tacking stitches, hang Stockings, and wait for Santa!

## HOW TO EMBROIDER STEM STITCH



Use this stitch to add a loved one's name (or yours) to the top cuff of these stripy stockings!

Step 1 Trace a name onto felt using a pencil or disappearing marker, insert your needle from the back of the fabric at the start of the first traced letter, pull through, insert from front to back further along line then back to front halfway between.


Step 2 Pull thread all the way through and pull to tighten and secure first stitch, then insert your needle again from front to back further along line, keeping the same length as the first stitch, and again from back to front halfway between.


Step 3 Continue to work the following stitches in the same way as in the previous steps until the end of the traced line/letter, fasten off and repeat all steps for the next and subsequent lines/letters.


Tip Work one line at a time, remembering to knot the first end of your thread before starting, and fastening off at the end by knotting the thread at the back of your fabric.


## STRIPY CROCHET BAUBLES <br> 0

## Measurements

Bauble diameter 6.5 cm

## Gauge/Tension

Tension is not critical for this project, but different measurements may result in different yarn amounts needed; keep sts tight to prevent stuffing from showing through fabric

## Pattern Notes

Baubles are made in two halves that are stitched tog and stuffed. Hanging Loop is added to complete.

## Instructions

## BAUBLE 1 (MAKE 2 HALVES)

Using Yarn A, ch4.
Round 1 (RS) 11tr in fourth ch from hook (skipped 3 chs count as 1 tr), ss to first tr to join. [12 tr] Fasten off.
Round 2 (RS) Join Yarn D with ss to first tr of prev round, ch2 (counts as 1 htr ), 1 htr in same tr as ss, (2htr in next tr) 11 times, ss to first htr. [24 htr] Fasten off.
Round 3 Join Yarn F with ss to space between first 2 htr , ch2 (counts as $1 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{ch}$ ), (1dc in space between next 2 htr , ch1) 11 times, ss to first dc. [12 dc, 12 ch-sps] Fasten off.
Round 4 Join Yarn E with ss to first ch-sp, ch2 (counts as 1 htr ), 2 htr in same ch-sp as ss, (3htr in next ch-sp) 11 times, ss to firsthtr. [36 htr] Fasten off.
Next round is worked using extended dc sts; for each dc, insert hook into st direcly below Round 3.
Round 5 Join Yarn A with ss to first st, ch1 (does not count as st), (1 extended dc in corresponding st of Round 3, ch2) 12 times, ss to first st.
[12 dc, 12 ch-2 sps]
Fasten off.
Round 6 Join Yarn F with ss to first ch-2 sp, ch2
(counts as 1 htr ), 2 htr in same ch-2 sp, (3htr in next ch-2 sp) 11 times, ss to first htr. [36 htr] Fasten off.
Round 7 Join Yarn D with ss to first htr, ch2 (counts as 1 htr ), 35 htr , ss to first htr. Fasten off.
Round 8 Join Yarn E with ss to first htr, ch1 (does

## BAUBLE 2 (MAKE 2 HALLES)

Using Yarn C, ch2.
Round 1 (RS) 6dc in second ch from hook, 5dc, ss to first st to join. [6 dc]
Fasten off.
Round 2 (RS) Join Yarn F with ss to firstst, ch1
(does not count as st), 2dc in each st around, ss to
first st. [12 dc]
Fasten off.
Round 3 Join Varn D with ss to first st, ch2
(counts as $1 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{ch}$ ), (1dc, ch1) 11 times, ss to first dc. [12 dc, $12 \mathrm{ch}-\mathrm{sps}$ ]

Fasten off.
Round 4 Join Yarn B with ss to first ch-sp, ch2
(counts as 1 htr ), 1 htr in same ch-sp as ss, (2htr in next ch-sp) 11 times, ss to first htr. [24 htr] Fasten off.
Round 5 Join Yarn C with ss to first st, ch2 (counts as 1 htr ), 2htr in next st, (1htr, 2htr in next st) 11 times, ss to first htr. [36 htr] Fasten off.
Round 6 Join Yarn F with ss to first st, ch2 (counts as $1 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{ch})$, skip 1 st, (1dc, ch1, skip 1 st) 17 times, ss to first dc. [18 dc, 18 ch-sps]
Fasten off.
Round 7 Join Yarn D with ss to first ch-sp, ch2
(counts as 1 htr ), 1htr in same ch-sp as ss, (2htr in next ch-sp) 17 times, ss to first htr. [36 htr] Fasten off.
Round 8 Join Yarn B with ss to first st, ch2 (counts as 1 htr ), 35 htr , ss to first htr.

Fasten off.
Round 9 Join Yarn C with ss to first st, rep Round 8.
Fasten off, leaving 30cm tail for joining both Bauble halves.

## BAUBLE 3

To form spiral centre, each colour is joined at centre, then when adding next colour or changing colours on subsequent rounds, remove hook, drop yarn and with hook pick up Ip of next colour. Extend dropped Ip or mark Ip with stitch marker to prevent unravelling. Do not fasten off or cut yarn between changes.

## First Half

Using Yarn C, ch2.
Round 1 (RS) (2dc, 1htr) in second ch from hook, drop YarnC and join Yarn F with ss in same ch, ch1 (does not count as st), (2dc, 1htr) in same ch, drop Yarn F and join Yarn D with ss in same ch, ch1 (does not count as st), (2dc, 1htr) in same ch. [9 sts]
Round 2 (RS) Using Yarn C, (2htr in next st) 3 times, change to Yarn F, (2htr in next st) 3 times, change to Yarn D, (2htr in next st) 3 times. [18 htr]
Round 3 Using Yarn C, (1htr, 2htr in next st) 3times, change to Yarn F, (1htr, 2htr in next st) 3 times, change to Yarn D, (1htr, 2htr in next st) 3 times. [27 htr]
Round 4 Using Varn C, (2htr, 2htr in next st) 3 times, change to Yarn F, (2htr, 2htr in next st) 3 times, change to Yarn D, (2htr, 2htr in next st) 3times. [36 htr]
Rounds 5-7 Using Yarn C, 12htr, change to Yarn F, 12htr, change to Yarn D, 12htr. [36 dc]

Round 8 Using Yarn C, 12dc, change to Yarn F, 12dc, change to Yarn D, 12dc. [36 dc] Fasten off each colour, leaving 15 cm tail for joining Bauble halves.

## Second Half

Work as for First Half but add and work colours in reverse order as follows: Yarn D, F and C.

## HANGING LOOP

Using embroidery thread, ch2.
Round 1 (RS) 8dc in second ch from hook, ss blo to firstst to join. [8dc]
Round 2 (RS) Ch2 (counts as 1 htr ), 7htr blo, ss to firsthtr. [8 htr]
Fasten off, leaving 15 cm tail for joining.

## ASSEMBLY

Place Bauble halves tog with RS facing outwards, and using yarn tails, stitch them tog, stuff before closing. Stitch Hanging Loop across seam at top, using photo as a guide. Cut a 24 cm length of embroidery thread. Thread through top of Hanging Loop, knot ends tog and trim.

## TO FINISH

Weave in remaining ends.

## QUICK STRIPY CHRISTMAS TRIFLE <br> $\sim \sim \sim \sim$
