STEGOSAURUS PRAM GARLAND

Gauge/Tension 36 sts and 46 rows to measure 10 x 10cm over st st using 2.25mm needles

Measurements Knitted Dinosaur 7 x 15cm

Abbreviations

[] number of sts on a given row beg beginning k knit

k2tog knit 2 sts together: insert needle kwise into first two sts and knit them together **kfb** knit front and back to increase by 1 st: insert needle kwise into next st: knit as normal but don't

slip st from needle, instead bring needle around to back and knit through back loop of same st **kwise** knitwise p purl pwise purlwise rem remaining rep repeat(s) RS right side(s) ssk slip slip knit: slip 1 st kwise, slip next st kwise, insert left needle into front of slipped sts and knit them together st(s) stitch(es) st st stocking stitch: RS knit, WS purl WS wrong side(s) (....) x times work the instructions between brackets the *total* number of times stated

Pattern Notes

Use knitted cast on throughout. Body is worked in one piece then folded in half to form dinosaur. Scales, Spots and Legs are worked separately and stitched to Body.

Elastic cord is threaded with Dinosaur, silicone beads and teething rings to form garland.

Instructions

BODY

Using Yarn A, cast on 16 sts. Beg with a k row, work 2 rows in st st. [16 sts] **Row 3 (RS)** K1, kfb, k to last 2 sts, kfb, k1, [18 sts] Row 4 (WS) Purl. Rep Rows 3-4 five more times. [28 sts] Rows 15-18 Work 4 rows in st st. **Row 19** Rep Row 3. [30 sts] Row 20 Cast on 5 sts at beg of row, p to end. [35 sts] Rep Rows 3-4 twice more. [39 sts] Row 25 Cast on 6 sts at beg of row, k to end. [45 sts] Row 26 Purl. Rows 27-28 Rep Rows 25-26. [51 sts] Rows 29-30 Work 2 rows in st st. **Row 31** K to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. [50 sts] Row 32 Purl. **Row 33-34** Rep Rows 31-32. [49 sts] **Row 35** K to last 2 sts, kfb, k1. [50 sts] Row 36 Purl. Rows 37-38 Rep Rows 35-36. [51 sts] Rows 39-40 Work 2 rows in st st. Row 41 Cast off 6 sts, k to end. [45 sts] Row 42 Purl. Rows 43-44 Rep Rows 41-42. [39 sts] **Row 45** K1, ssk, k to last 3 sts, k2tog, k1. [37 sts] Row 46 Purl. **Row 47** Rep Row 45. [35 sts] Row 48 Cast off 5 sts pwise, p to end. [30 sts] **Rows 49-50** Rep Rows 45-46. [28 sts]

Rows 51-54 Work 4 rows in st st. Rep Rows 45-46 six more times. [16 sts] Cast off.

SPOT (MAKE 4)

Using Yarn C, cast on 16 sts. **Row 1 (WS)** Knit. **Row 2 (RS)** (K2tog) 8 times. [8 sts] Break yarn, thread through rem sts, pull tight.

SCALE (MAKE 5)

Using Yarn B, cast on 8 sts. **Rows 1-4** Knit. **Row 5 (RS)** K2tog, k to end. [7 sts] **Rows 6-10** Rep Row 5 a further five times. [2 sts] Break yarn, thread through rem sts, pull tight.

LEG (MAKE 4)

Using Yarn A, cast on 12 sts. **Rows 1-12** Beg with a k row, work 12 rows in st st. Cast off.

ASSEMBLY

Use photo as guide. Fold Body in half, join sides, stuffing as you close. Embroider eyes with black yarn, adding highlight st with Yarn C. Stitch Scales to back, then join side edges of Spots to form circle, stitch to Body. Fold Legs in half, join cast-on/cast-off edges, gather sides at top and bottom, stitch to secure. Do not stuff Legs and join to sides of Body. Weave in all ends. Thread Dinosaur, beads and rings onto elastic, passing through top of Dinosaur Body, place stoppers and clips at each end, cut elastic.



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EMBROIDERY STITCHES

Use the illustrations below as a guide to working the stitches in the Brontosaurus Embroidery project. See Pattern Notes if you need more help.





Measurements 15.5cm diameter

Abbreviations RS right side st(s) stitch(es)

Pattern Notes

Brontosaurus is worked using various sts: see Schematic 1 for st placement and colours, and Embroidery Stitches feature for working sts. For written stitch instructions, visit: *bit.ly/simys-embroidery-tutorial.* Separate all threads and use number of strands as indicated.

Instructions

PREPARE FABRIC

Step 1 Tape design to window or lightbox, position fabric on top with RS facing up and trace design centrally using water-soluble pen.
Step 2 With traced design facing up, mount fabric into embroidery hoop and screw tight to secure, making sure not to distort image.

EMBROIDERY

Step 3 Using three strands of Colour A and following purple lines, use back st for mouth, sleepy eye, toe and outline. Work broken lines in running st and nostril with small French knot (wrap yarn around needle once only). Step 4 Using two strands of Colour B and following green lines, use back st to create stem and detached chain sts for leaves.

Step 5 Using two strands of Colour C and following lilac lines, fill in toes with satin st, work slanted Cretan sts at middle of rear paw and along spine and work French knots at belly. Using one strand of Colour C. work French knots at back of neck.

Step 6 Using two strands of Colour D and following pink lines, work Cretan sts at neck and back of rear paw, and work buttonhole sts at middle of front paw. Using one strand of Colour D, work lazy daisy sts at neck.

Step 7 Using two strands of Colour E and following blue lines, work double seed sts at

Pattern Notes

Scarf and Hood are worked back and forth in rows, turning after each row, and finished with Border. Hood is then attached to Scarf, and joined together at top to create Hood shape. Collar and Horns are then attached to Hood, and Pockets to RS of Scarf at each end. Claws decorate ends of Pockets. Beg ch(s) **do not** count as st(s) throughout. For Border rounds, work 7dc per 4 rows of tr evenly along edge.

Suitable for children 4-6 years old, or teens and adults with adaptations (see page 10).

Instructions

SCARF

Using 6mm hook and Yarn A, ch18. Change to 5mm hook.

Row 1 (RS) 1tr in fourth ch from hook (skipped 3 chs do not count as st), 1tr in each ch to end, turn. [15 sts]

Rows 2 (WS)-68 Ch3, 1tr in each st, turn. [15 sts] Rounded End of Scarf

Row 1 (RS) Ch3, tr2tog, 1tr in each st to last 2 sts, tr2tog, turn. [9 sts]

Row 2 (WS)-3 Rep Row 1.

Row 4 Ch3, (tr2tog) twice, 1tr, (tr2tog) twice. [5 sts]

Row 5 Ch1, 1dc, 1htr, 2tr in next st, 1htr, 1dc. [6 sts] Fasten off.

MAKE A MATCHING SET

This children's pattern is **easy to adapt** for teens and adults. The generous size of the Hood means you only need to make the **Scarf section longer** by simply adding rows to reach your desired length. This way, you can create this cosy accessory **for the whole family**! You may require additional yarn. Join Yarn A with ss to other end of Scarf and work along other side of foundation chs. Rep Rows 1-5 of Rounded End of Scarf.

Border

Note: work 7dc per 4 rows of tr. **Round 1 (RS)** Using 5mm hook, join Yarn A with ss to Scarf edge, ch1, work dc evenly around, ss to first dc to join, **do not** turn.

Round 2 (RS) Ch1, 1dc in each st around, ss to first dc, fasten off.

POCKET (MAKE 2)

Using 6mm hook and Yarn A, ch18. Change to 5mm hook.

Row 1 (RS) 1tr in fourth ch from hook (skipped 3 chs do not count as st), 1tr in each ch to end, turn. [15 sts]

Rows 2 (WS)-5 Ch3, 1tr in each st to end, turn. Rounded End of Pocket

Rows 6-8 Ch3, tr2tog, 1tr in each st to last 2 sts, tr2tog. [9 sts]

Row 9 Ch3, (tr2tog) twice, 1tr, (tr2tog) twice. [5 sts]

Row 10 Ch1, 1dc, 1htr, 2tr in next st, 1htr, 1dc. [6 sts] Fasten off.

Border

Note: work 7dc per 4 rows of tr.

Round 1 (RS) Using 5mm hook, join Yarn A with ss to Pocket edge, ch1, work dc evenly around, work (1dc, ch2, 1dc) in corners at top, ss to first dc to join, **do not** turn.

Round 2 (RS) Work dc evenly around, work (1dc, ch2, 1dc) in ch-2 sps, ss to first dc. Fasten off, attach Pocket to end of Scarf.

CLAW (MAKE 8)

Using 5mm hook and Yarn C, make mr. This section is worked using the amigurumi method. **Round 1 (RS)** 6dc into ring. [6 sts] **Round 2 (RS)** 1dc in each st around. [6 sts] **Round 3** (1dc, 2dc in next st) 3 times, ss to first dc to close. [9 sts] Fasten off. Stuff Claws and attach four to each Pocket.

HOOD

Fold Scarf in half and place st marker at centre point. Count 25 sts from this marker on both sides and place additional markers to indicate position of Hood.

Using 5mm hook, join Yarn A with ss to Scarf at st marker on far right.

Row 1 (RS) Ch3, 1tr in each st to final st marker, turn. [50 sts]

Move centre st marker up as you go to mark centre of Hood for shaping.

Rows 2 (WS)-16 Ch3, 1tr in each st, turn. [50 sts] Rows 17-20 Ch3, 1tr in each st to 2 sts before st marker, (tr2tog) twice, 1tr in each st to end. [42 sts]

Row 21 Ch3, 1tr in each st to 3 sts before st marker, tr6tog, 1tr in each st to end. [37 sts] Fasten off, join seam at top of Hood.

Edging

Using 5mm hook, join Yarn A with ss to front edge of Hood.

Row 1 (RS) Work dc evenly across front of Hood to end, end row with ss in Scarf, fasten off.

HORN (MAKE 2)


Using 5mm hook and Yarn C, make mr. This section is worked using the amigurumi method. **Round 1 (RS)** 6dc into ring. [6 sts] **Round 2 (RS)** 6dc. [6 sts] **Round 3** (1dc, 2dc in next st) 3 times. [9 sts] **Round 4** 9dc. [9 sts] **Round 5** (2dc, 2dc in next st) 3 times. [12 sts] **Round 6** (Dc2tog) twice, 3dc, 2dc in next 2 sts, 3dc. [12 sts] **Round 7-12** 12dc. [12 sts] **Round 13** 12dc, ss to first dc to join. [12 sts] Fasten off. Stuff Horns and attach to Hood.

COLLAR (MAKE 2)

Using 6mm hook and Yarn B, ch44. Change to 5mm hook.

Row 1 (RS) 1tr in fourth ch from hook (skipped 3 chs do not count as st), 40tr, turn. [41 sts] **Row 2 (WS)** Ch3, (6tr, 3tr in next st) 5 times, 6tr, turn. [51 sts]

 ${\bf Row}~{\bf 3}$ Ch3, 7tr, 3tr in next st, (8tr, 3tr in next

st) 4 times, 7tr. [61 sts]

Row 4 Ch3, 8tr, 3tr in next st, (10tr, 3tr in next st) 4 times, 8tr. [71 sts] Fasten off.

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Work second Collar.

Place both Collar pieces WS together and using 5mm hook, join Yarn B with ss to bottom corner on right-hand side and join together as follows:

Round 5 (RS) Ch1, 7dc evenly across side, ch6, 1ss in fourth ch, 2tr in next st, 1htr, 6dc, (1htr, (2tr, ch3, 1ss in first ch, 2tr) in next st, 1htr, 10dc) 4 times, 1htr, (2tr, ch3, 1ss in first ch, 2tr) in next st, 1htr, 6dc, 1htr, 2tr in next st, ch3, 1s in first ch, ch3, 7dc evenly across side. Fasten off. Attach Collar to Hood, behind Horns.

TO FINISH

Weave in all ends. Block to measurements.



Do you know your dinosaurs? Brush up on some trivia in between crafting sessions!

 Like the Brontosaurus on page 5, the vast majority of these mighty dinosaurs were plant eaters.

 Before they went extinct about
 65 million years ago, there were more than 700 species of dinosaur.

3 One of the biggest dinosaurs to roam our planet was the *Argentinosaurus*, weighing up to 100 tonnes (around the same as 15 elephants!).

4 Lizards, turtles, snakes and crocodiles are all direct descendants of these fascinating creatures.

5 The *Micropachycephalosaurus* may have the longest dino name, but it means 'tiny, thick-headed lizard'.

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
