## JaMMY DODGER CUSHION

## Gauge/Tension

Rounds $1-5$ of Biscuit Piece measure $\varnothing 10.5 \mathrm{~cm}$
using a 4 mm hook

## Measurements

0 $38 \mathrm{~cm} \times 9 \mathrm{~cm}$ high

d diameter

ch(s) chain(s) or chain stitch(es)
blo back loop only: insert hook under back loop only
dc double crochet

## Pattern Notes

Biscuit Pieces are worked in rounds, joining each round with ss. Ribbed Biscuit Edging is worked in rows and formed into a loop before joining to Biscuit Pieces. Heart is worked in both rows and rounds, then stitched to top of Biscuit Pieces. Knitted cord is added as embellishment.

Making an i-cord on double pointed needles also does the trick: cast on 3 sts, knit, slide work to other end, pull tight,knit and repeat!

## Instructions

## BISCUIT PIECE (MAKE 2: 1 FOR BOTTOM, 1 FOR TOP)

With Yarn A, make mr.
Round 1 (RS) Ch2 (does not count as st throughout), 9htr into ring, ss to first st to join. [ 9 htr ]
Round 2 (RS) Ch2, (2htr in next tr) 9 times, ss to firstst. [18 htr]
Round 3 Ch2, (2htr in nextst, 1htr) 9 times, ss to firstst. [27 htr]
Round 4Ch2, (2htr in nextst, 2htr) 9 times, ss to firstst.[36 htr]
Round 5 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 3htr) 9 times, ss to firstst.[45 htr]
Round 6 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 4htr) 9 times, ss to firstst.[54 htr]
Round 7 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 5htr) 9 times, ss to firstst. [63htr]
Round 8 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 6htr) 9 times, ss to firstst.[72 htr]
Round 9 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 7htr) 9 times, ss to firstst.[81 htr]
Round $10 \mathrm{Ch2}$, (2htr in next st, 8 htr) 9 times, ss to firstst.[90 htr]
Round 11 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 9htr) 9 times, ss to firstst.[99 htr]
Round 12 Ch2, (2htr in nextst, 10htr) 9 times, ss to firstst. [108 htr]
Round 13 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 11htr) 9 times, ss to forstst. [117 htr]
Round 14 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 12 htr ) 9 times, ss to firstst. [126 htr]

Round 15 Ch2, (2htr in nextst, 13 htr) 9 times, ss to firstst. [135 htr]
Round 16 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 14htr) 9 times, ss to firstst. [144 htr]
Round 17 Ch2, (2htr in next st, 15htr) 9 times, ss to firstst. [153 htr]
Fasten off and change to Yarn B.
Round 18 Chi (does not count as st throughout), 153dc blo, ss to first dc. [153dc blo]
Rounds 19-23 Ch1, 153dc, ss to first dc. [153 dc]
Bottom Piece only
Fasten off and put aside.

## Top Piece only

Round 24 Ch1, (2dc flo in nextst, 2htr flo in each of next 2 sts, 2dc flo in nextst, 3ss flo, 3dc flo in next st, 3ss flo, 5t flo in next st, 2ss flo, 3dc flo in next st, $2 s$ sflo) 9 times, ss to firstdc. [261 sts] Fasten off, leaving 60 cm tail for joining.

## JOIN BISCUIT PIECES

Place zip adjacent to edge, beside yarn tails. With needle and thread, st zip to edge of Biscuit Pieces. Using yarn tail, join rem sts together by stitching through last round of Bottom Piece and rem back loops from Round 24 of Top piece. Insert foam pad.

## BISCUIT EDGING

With Yarn A, ch4.
Row 1 (RS) 1dc in second ch from hook (skipped ch-1 does not count as st), 2dc, turn. [3 dc]
Row 2 (WS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout),
3 dd blo, turn. [3 dc blo]
Rows 3-152 Rep Row 2.
Row 153 Ch1, 3dc blo, do not turn.

Continue to work around edge of first Bicsuit Piece as follows:
(RS) Ch1, work 153dc evenly across long side of Biscuit Edging, ch1, place both short ends with WS together, 3dc across short side, making sure to work through both layers to join sides, do not fasten off.

## Join Edging to Biscuit Pieces

(RS) Ch1, insert hook through dc across rem long side and through rem front loop from Round 18 of Biscuit Piece, (1dc, 1ss) in each set of sts around, ss to first de to join. [153 dc, 153 ss]
Fasten off and weave in ends.
Rep for second Biscuit Piece.

## HEART

## Top (make 2)

With Yarn B, make mr.
Row 1 (RS) Chl (does not count as st throughout), 3dc into ring, do not join, turn. [3 dc]
Row 2 (WS) Ch1, (2dc in next st) 3 times, turn. [6 dc]
Row 3 Ch1, (2dc in next st, 1dc) 3 times. [9 dc]
Row 4 Ch1, (2dc in next st, 2dc) 3 times. [12 dc] Fasten off.
Rep Rows $1-4$ for second Top, turn, do not fasten off and continue to work Bottom.
Bottom
Row 5 (RS) Ch1, 7dc across flat side, 7dc across flat side of first Top to join pieces together, turn. [14 dc]
Row 6 (WS) Ch1, 14de, turn.
Row 7 Chl, dc2tog, 10dc, dc2tog. [2 dc2tog, 10 dc ] Row 8 Chl, 12dc.

Row 9 Ch1, dc2tog, 8dc, dc2tog. [2 dc2tog, 8 dc ] Row 10 Ch1, 10dc.
Row 11 Ch1, dc2tog, 6dc, dc2tog. [2 dc2tog, 6 dc] Row $12 \mathrm{Ch1}, 8 \mathrm{dc}$.
Row 13 Ch1, dc2tog, 4dc, dc2tog. [2 dc2tog, 4 dc ]
Row $14 \mathrm{Ch1}, 6 \mathrm{dc}$.
Row 15 Ch1, dc2tog, 2dc, dc2tog. [2 dc2tog, 2 dc]
Row 16 Ch1, 4dc.
Row 17 Ch1, 2dc2tog. [2dc2tog]
Row 18 Ch1, dc2tog. [dc2tog]
Continue to work around Heart.
Round 1 (RS) Work 1 1dc evenly across row ends of right-hand side of Heart, (2dc in next st, 3dc) 3 times, (3dc, 2dc in next st) 3 times, work 14dc evenly across row end of left-hand side of Heart, ss to first dc to join. [58 dc]
Fasten off Yarn B.
Join Yarn A with ss to ary st.
Round 2 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st), (1dc, 1ss) in each st around, ss to firstdc. [58 dc, 58 ss] Fasten off, leaving 40cm tail for sewing.

## ASSEMBLY

St Heart to centre of top Biscuit Piece.
With Yarn C and knitting mill, make 150cm cord, fasten off, leaving 150 cm yarn tail. Weave in tail through final sts of cord to secure sts. St both ends of cord together to make loop. Securely st loop to top of Biscuit Piece in wiggly fashion (use photo as guide).

## TO FINISH

Weave in rem ends.

## KEEP YOUR PROJECTS SPICK AND SPAN

## QUILTED OVEN MITTS Q

## Measurements

$83 \times 18 \mathrm{~cm}$

## Abbreviations

Ø diameter
RS right side(s)
st(s) stitch(es)
WS wrong side(s)

## Pattern Notes

Oven Mitts are made using interlined fabric, padded with wadding for insulation, that is quilted prior to assembly. Star motifs decorate pink Gloves. Handmade bias binding is used for hanging loop and is sewn around all edges to finish.
Use walking foot of sewing machine to prevent layers shifting (optional). For quilting, set st length to 3 , and for machine basting, set st length to 5 .
Refer to manufacturer's instructions for fusing patches and interlining to fabric.

## Instructions

## PREPARE FABRIC

Step 1 Iron fabrics and trim selvedges. Line up left straight edge of Fabric A on mat. Cut fabric to 85 cm width, and place remaining fabric aside. Cut 85 cm -wide piece into two $85 \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}$ rectangles. From Fabric B, cut four $23 \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}$ pieces. Cut and fuse interlining to WS of all six pieces. Cut two 85 $\times 20 \mathrm{~cm}$ and four $23 \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}$ pieces of wadding.

## PREPARE BINDING

Step 2 Take remaining Fabric A and cut enough 5 cm -wide strips diagonally on $45^{\circ}$ angle to make following lengths: $1 \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}, 2 \times 25 \mathrm{~cm}$ and $1 \times$ 220 cm . To make longest strip, join strips following instructions on bias binding maker.
Step 3 Feed strips through bias binding maker and press.
Step 4 To prepare hanging loop, fold 20 cm piece in half lengthways with raw edges enclosed. Start 2 mm in from long edge, sew to end to secure. Trim strip to 15 cm , cutting ends straight across.

## QULITING

Step 5 With RS facing out, sandwich two layers of wadding between interlined Fabric A pieces. Spray baste between each layer to hold in place, carefully aligning edges and smoothing fabric.
Step 6 Draw diagonal lines 5 cm apart at $45^{\circ}$ angle on one side of Fabric A with marker. Repeat in opposite direction. Working from centre out, sew along drawn lines with white thread.
Step 7 Trim edges to neaten. Machine baste around cut edges and sponge away pen marks.

## GLOVES

Step 8 Fuse star centrally on RS of two Fabric B pieces, keeping direction of star in mind. Spray baste a $23 \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}$ piece of wadding to each $23 \times 20 \mathrm{~cm}$ Fabric $B$ piece. With green thread and zigzag st, sew around star edges to further secure.
Step 9 With RS of Fabric B facing out, make two quilt sandwiches, each star piece back to back with plain piece of fabric.

## PRETTY AND PRACTICAL!

With a double layer of the heat-resistant Vlieseline Thermolan wadding, these mittens will protect your precious hands from the heat of your delicious cake, fresh from the oven. Together with the Tissu de Marie $100 \%$ cotton fabrics, which are naturally resistant to heat, these carefully selected materials will ensure that this beautiful project is functional and long-lasting. So now you can bake (and eat!) to your heart's content.

Step 10 Sew 25 cm piece of binding to inner short side edge of each Glove.

## ASSEMBLY

See Schematic 1:Layout.
Step 11 With RS facing up, place Glove pieces at each end of quilted section. Line up short edges and trim long edges flush with quilted piece.
Machine baste long sides of each Glove section to hold in place.
Step 12 Use marker to draw curve at each end using plate/dish as guide. Cut around and machine baste around curve.
Step 13 Mark centre point of one long side.
Position 15 cm hanging loop towards centre with cut ends either side of mark and baste in place.
Step 14 Sew 220 cm bias binding strip all around edge. Sew slowly around curve. Before turning binding to back, trim any excess fabric around curve so even amount of binding showing all the way around. Press binding, turn to back and sew in place.

## TO FINISH

Cut off all thread tails and iron Oven Mitts to neaten surface if desired.

Tension is not critical for this project, but different

## Measurements

Approx. 7 cm high and 10 cm long

## Abbreviations

[ ] number of sts on a given row
as folls as follows
beg beginning
k knit
k2tog knit 2 sts together: insert needle kwise into first two sts and then knit them tog
kfb knit front and back to increase by 1 st: insert needle kwise into next st; knit as normal but don't
slip st from needle, instead bring needle around to
back and knit through back loop of same st
kwise knitwise
pwise purlwise
p purl
p2tog purl 2 sts together: insert needle pwise into first two sts and then purl them tog
rep repeat
RS right side
st(s) stitch(es)
st st stocking stitch: RS knit, WS purl
tog together
WS wrong side
yo yarn over

## Special Abbreviation

MB make bobble as folls: ( k 1 , yo, k 1, yo, k 1 ) into next st, turn, p 5 working into back of each st, turn, k 5 , turn, p 5 , turn, k 5 , with tip of left-hand needle, bring second st over first and off needle, rep for third, fourth and fifth sts

## Pattern Notes

Pincushion is knitted flat in three pieces: Cake (one long strip folded into a triangle along knitted ridges), Icing and Base pieces, stitched tog with stiff cardboard on base for shape and stability. Cherry is knitted separately and stitched to top, a twisted cord is added as stalk and straight sts for 'shine' effect (use photo as guide).

## Instructions

## CAKE

With Yarn A, cast on 74 sts.
Row 1 (RS) K26, p1, k20, p1, k26. [74 sts]
Row 2 (WS) P26, k1, p20,k1, p26.
Rows 3-12 Rep Rows 1-2 a further 5 times.
Change to Yarn B.
Rows 13-14 Knit.
Change to Yarn C.
Rows 15-16 Knit.
Change to Varn B.
Rows 17-18 Knit.
Change to Varn A.
Rows 19-30 Rep Rows 1-12.
Change to Varn C.
With Yarn C, work bobble cast off as folls: with RS facing, k2, *pass second st on right-hand needle
over first, MB, (pass second st on right-hand needle over first, k 1 ) 3 times; rep from * to last st, k1, pass second st on right-hand needle over first. Fasten off.

## BASE/ICING (MAKE 2 PIECES: 1 FOR BASE IN YaRN A, 1 FOR ICLNG IN YARN D)

Cast on 28 sts.
Row 1 (RS) Knit. [28sts]
Row 2 (WS) Purl.
Row 3 K2tog, kto last 2 sts, k2tog. [26 sts]
Rows 4-6 Beg with a p row, work 3 rows in st st.
Rows 7-50 Rep Rows 3-6 a further 11 times.
[4sts]
Row 51 (K2tog) twice. [2 sts]
Row 52 P2tog. Cast off remaining st.

## CHERRV

With Yarn B, cast on 3 sts.
Row 1 (RS) (Kfb) 3 times. [6 sts]
Row 2 (WS) Purl.
Row 3 (Kfb) 6 times. [12 sts]
Row 4 Purl.
Row 5 (Kfb) 12 times. [24 sts]
Rows 6-10 Beg with a p row, work 5 rows in stst.
Row 11 (K2tog) 12 times. [12 sts]
Row 12 Purl.
Row 13 (K2tog) 6 times. [6 sts]
Row 14 Purl.
Row 15 (K2tog) 3 times. [3 sts]
Break yarn and thread through remaining 3 sts, pull tightly to close.

## ASSEMBLY

Join row ends of Cake piece using mattress st (forms tip of cake slice). Oversew Icing piece to cast-off edge of Cake piece, matching tip of Icing to tip of Cake. Oversewn sts can be hidden behind bobbles. Icing piece should be eased in to fit, allowing the lcing to 'bulge' above Cake.
Create cardboard base by tracing around Base piece onto stiff cardboard and cutting out. St two long sides of Base in place, insert cardboard inside cake slice, stuff and close opening. Join row ends of Cherry, leaving gap for stuffing. Stuff Cherry and close gap. Make twisted cord in Yarn B by cutting two 12cm lengths of yarn and twisting them tog until they curl back onto themselves. Allow to twist and knot ends tog, creating approx. 3cm stalk. St folded end of twisted cord into gathered top of Cherry. Using Yarn C, embroider two straight sts on Cherry for 'shine'. Join Cherry to top of cake.

## TO FINISH

Weave in ends.



## PIECE OF CAKE!

Satisfy your sweet tooth with this simple 5-minute sponge cake cheat

Ingredients
Handful fresh strawberries

- Strawberry jam

Ready-made plain sponge cake
Lashings of whipped cream

- Chocolate syrup (optional)


## Method

- Slice the sponge cake into two halves
- Spread the jam on one half, top with sliced fresh strawberries and cream
- Serve with more berries and/or a drizzle of chocolate syrup for a tasty twist!
