GOLDEN HOUR SCARF

Gauge/Tension

13 sts and 18 rows to measure 10 x 10cm over st st using 6mm needles.

Measurements

32 x 210cm after blocking

Abbreviations

k knit

p purl

rep(s) repeat(s)

RS right side

st(s) stitch(es)

st st stocking stitch: RS knit, WS purl

WS wrong side

(......) once/twice/to end work the instructions between brackets the total number of times stated

Pattern Notes

Scarf is worked in rows. Turn work after each row.

Instructions

Cast on 42 sts.

Rows 1-8 K to end.

Row 9 (WS) K6, p3, (k1, p3) to last 5 sts, k5.

Row 10 (RS) K5, p1, k5, (p1, k1, p1, k5) to last 7 sts, p1, k6.

Row 11 K5, p2, k1, (p3, k1) to last 6 sts, p1, k5.

Row 12 K7, p1, k1, p1, (k5, p1, k1, p1) to last 8 sts, k8.

Rows 13-28 Rep Rows 9-12 four more times.

Row 29 K5, p4, k1, (p7, k1) to last 8 sts, p3, k5.

Row 30 K12, p1, (k7, p1) to last 5 sts, k5.

Row 31 K5, p1, k1, p5, (k1, p1, k1, p5) to last 6 sts,

Scheepjes Chunky Monkey

(100% Premium Acrylic (Anti Pilling); 100g/116m) 1823 Mustard x 5 balls 6mm knitting needles

Row 93 K5, p32, k5.

Rows 94-98 Rep Rows 30-34.

Row 99 K5, p32, k5.

Row 100 K to end.

Row 101 K6, p7, (k1, p7) to last 5 sts, k5.

Rows 102-104 Rep Rows 10-12.

Row 105 K5, p4, k1, (p7, k1) to last 8 sts, p3, k5.

Row 106 K to end.

Row 107 K5, p32, k5.

Rows 108-112 Rep Rows 30-34.

Row 113 K5, p32, k5.

Rows 114-161 Rep Rows 86-93 six more times.

Rows 162-170 Rep Rows 92-100.

Rows 171-179 Rep Rows 99-107.

Rows 180-186 Rep Rows 92-98

Rows 187-188 Rep Rows 99-100.

Rows 189-197 Rep Rows 99-107.

Rows 198-199 Rep Rows 92-93.

Rows 200-204 Rep Rows 30-34.

Rows 205-208 Rep Rows 99-100 twice more.

Row 209 Rep Row 99.

Rows 210-259 Rep Rows 200-209 five more times.

Rows 260-267 Rep Rows 100-107.

Rows 268-271 Rep Rows 92-93 twice more.

Rows 272-276 Rep Rows 30-34.

Rows 277-280 Rep Row 99-100 twice more.

Rows 281-289 Rep Rows 99-107.

Rows 290-293 Rep Rows 92-93 twice more.

Rows 294-298 Rep Rows 30-34.

Rows 299-304 Rep Rows 99-100 three more times.

Rows 305-311 Rep Rows 87-93.

Rows 312-315 Rep Rows 92-93 twice more.

Rows 316-323 Rep Rows 86-93.

Rows 324-327 Rep Rows 92-93 twice more.

Rows 328-375 Rep Rows 316-327 four more times.

Rows 376-384 K to end.

Cast off.



Weave in all ends and block to measurements.


HOW TO: FINISH PUNCH NEEDLE PROJECTS!

If you're new to punch needling, what you may not know is that behind all those neat little stitches and beautiful design lies a tangle of loops that when not properly secured, may unravel! To finish the back of your punch needle project and secure it from unravelling, follow one of these easy steps.

Use a paint brush to coat the back side of your punch needle project with a textile glue such as Gütermann's HT2 Textile Glue (item no. GHT2)! Stick a circular piece of fabric to fit just inside the hoop for a tidy finish.

Cut out a portion of strong, iron-on interfacing or stabiliser to cover the back side of your project and adhere as per product packaging instructions. Keep in mind that synthetic fibres are sensitive to beat and may not be suitable for ironing





NUTS ABOUT AUTUMN HANGER By Simy's Studio

Measurements

16 x 17cm





Pattern Notes

Always hold yarn loosely over your hand while punch needling, ensuring no tension. When there is tension, loops can unravel as you work. Insert needle through fabric as far as possible and carefully remove, keeping needle tip on surface of fabric. Move needle a few mm and insert/remove needle as previously. Work in rows back and forth so stitches appear staggered like 'bricks'. See schematic for colour placement and starting points.

Instructions

PREPARE FABRIC

Trace Acorn design with felt-tip pen on RS of fabric. Hold fabric to light box or window and use felt-tip pen to trace 'cap' of Acorn to WS. Clamp fabric into embroidery hoop and screw tight to secure.

FLAT STITCHES

Thread yarn through punch needle and with RS facing, insert needle through fabric. Pull yarn tail through to WS. Punch stitches in rows moving back and forth to fill in 'body' of Acorn. Note: Loops are created on WS. At final stitch, do not remove needle from fabric:

fasten off yarn at WS of work. Remove needle. Repeat for second Acorn, both stems, and both tips at the hottom of the Acorns.

LOOPED STITCHES

Thread yarn through punch needle and with WS of fabric facing, insert needle through fabric. Punch stitches to fill in 'cap' of Acorn working in a spiral from the outside in. Note: Loops are created on RS. At final stitch, do not remove needle from fabric: fasten off yarn at WS of work. Remove needle carefully, turn work RS facing. Repeat for second cap of acorn.

BACK STITCHES ON LOOPS

Thread tapestry needle with yarn, use back stitch to carefully sew loose stitches across 'cap' of Acorn to create diamond effect. Don't pull tight on yarn, the stitches should have same height as loops. Fasten off at WS of work and carefully weave in ends. Repeat for second Acorn.

To Finish

Finish back side of Hanger (see How To: Finish Punch Needle Projects! on p.5). If using a loosely woven fabric (i.e. with visible 'holes' that allow you to see through to the other side) and an opaque interfacing or stabiliser, trace your design (mirrored) onto the interfacing/stabiliser, cut out, and iron onto back of corresponding design only. Fabric surrounding your design won't have any backing, thus preserving the visual effect of the loosely woven fabric. Cut excess fabric at corners to create circle shape. With any colour yarn, sew around fabric using running stitch 1cm from edge. Make stitches approximately 1cm long. Pull tight, tie firmly and weave in ends.



Gauge/Tension

Finished Garland measures approx. 165cm Mushroom 7cm high Small Oak Leaf 7cm high Large Oak Leaf 8cm high Sweet Chestnut Leaf 7cm high Dog Rose Leaf 6cm high Rosehip Berry 1cm high

Pattern Notes

Mushroom and Rosehip Berry motifs are worked using the amigurumi method. Work sts continuously in a spiral without closing each round with ss. Mark first st of each round with m, moving it up as you go. Strengthen and shape Leaf motifs by blocking with a glue/water mix before attaching to hanging cord. Make glue/water mix by combining equal portions of PVA glue and water.

Instructions

MUSHROOM (MAKE 4)

Stalk

With Yarn A and 3mm hook, make mr.

Round 1 (RS) 10dc into ring. [10 dc]

Round 2 1dc blo in each st around. [10 dc blo]

Round 3 1dc in each st around. [10 dc]

Round 4 (Dc2tog, 3dc) twice. [2 dc2tog, 6 dc]

Rounds 5-6 1dc in each st around. [8 dc] Lightly stuff as you go for Rounds 7-10.

Round 7 (Dc2tog, 2dc) twice. [2 dc2tog, 4 dc]

Rounds 8-9 1dc in each st around. [6 dc]

Round 10 2dc in each st around, ss to beg dc to ioin. [12 dc]

Round 11 Ch3 (counts as 1 tr), 1tr in same st as join, 2tr in each st around, ss to beg 3-ch to join. [24 tr] Fasten off.

Top

With Yarn C and 2.5mm hook, make mr, leaving 20cm tail.

Round 1 (RS) 8dc into ring. [8 dc]

Round 2 (1dc, 2dc in next st) 4 times. [12 dc]

Round 3 (1dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [18 dc]

Round 4 1dc in each st around.

Round 5 (1dc, 2dc in next st) 9 times. [27 dc]

Round 6 (2dc, 2dc in next st) 9 times. [36 dc]

Round 7 1dc in each st around.

Round 8 (5dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [42 dc]

Round 9 Ss fairly tightly in each st around, fasten off. [42 ss]

Hanging Loop

Thread tail from start of Top onto needle, pass needle through starting mr from WS to RS and back

to WS again to make tiny hanging lp approx. 0.5cm high. Secure tail firmly on WS, fasten off.

Spots

Thread needle with 40cm length of Yarn A, tie firm knot in one end. Insert from WS of Top and sew approx. 20-25 tiny running sts at random intervals to create 'spots' on RS (use image as guide). Fasten off.

Assembly

Lightly stuff Top and place onto Stalk to fit neatly inside 'rim' of Top (Note: Stalk may need to be stretched slightly). Sew tog with tiny running sts around outside edge.

SMALL OAK LEAF (MAKE 5)

With Yarn D and 2.5mm hook, ch12.

Round 1 (RS) Work along ch: 1dc in second ch from hook, 4dc, 5htr, 5htr in last ch (pm in third htr to mark end st), work back along other side of ch, 5htr, 5dc, ch1, ss to beg dc, fasten off.

Round 2 (RS) Join Yarn E with 1dc in same st as join, 1htr, (1tr, ch2, 1ss) in next st, 1dc, 1htr, (2tr, ch3, 1ss) in next st, 1dc, 1htr, (1tr, 1dtr) in next st, (2dtr, ch3, 1ss) in next st, 1dc, 1tr, 6tr in end st (remove m), 1tr, 1dc, (1ss, ch3, 2dtr) in next st, (1dtr, 1tr) in next st, 1htr, 1dc, (1ss, ch3, 2tr) in next st, 1htr, 1dc, (1ss, ch2, 1tr) in next st, 1htr, 1dc, (1ss, ch5, 1ss) in ch-1 sp, ss surface crochet along centre starting ch of Leaf to end.

Fasten off.

LARGE OAK LEAF (MAKE 5)

Rep patt for Small Oak Leaf, using 3mm hook and Yarns F and G.



SWEET CHESTNUT LEAF (MAKE 5)

With Yarn H and 2.5mm hook, ch11.

Round 1 (RS) Work along ch: 1dc in second ch from hook, 1htr, 6tr, 1htr, 3dc in last ch (pm in second dc to mark end st), work back along other side of ch, 1htr, 6tr, 1htr, 1dc, ch1, ss to beg dc to join.

Round 2 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st), 1dc in same st as join, (2dc, 2dc in next st) twice, 3dc, (1dc, ch2, 1dc) in end st (remove m), 3dc, (2dc in next st, 2dc) twice, 1dc, 2dc in ch-1 sp, ss to beg dc, fasten off.

Round 3 (RS) Join Yarn I with 1dc in same st as join, 3dc, (1htr, 2htr in next st) twice, 1htr, 4dc, (1dc, picot, 1dc) in ch-2 sp, 4dc, (1htr, 2htr in next st) twice, 1htr, 5dc, (1dc, ch5, 1dc) in next st, 1dc, ss to beg dc, fasten off.

With Yarn I, work ss surface crochet along centre starting ch of Leaf from top to end.

Fasten off.

DOG ROSE LEAF (MAKE 5)

With Yarn J and 2.5mm hook, ch10.

Round 1 (RS) Work along ch: 1dc in second ch from hook, 1htr, 4tr, 2htr, 3dc in last ch (pm in second ch to mark end st), work back along other side of ch, 2htr, 4tr, 1htr, 1dc, ch1, ss to beg dc to join.

Round 2 (RS) Ch1, 1dc in same st as join, 1dc, (2dc in next st, 2dc) twice, 1dc, (1dc, picot, 1dc) in end st (remove m), 3dc, (2dc in next st, 2dc) twice, (1dc, ch5, 1dc) in ch-1 sp, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off.

ROSEHIP BERRY (MAKE 10)

With Yarn C and 2.5mm hook, make mr.

Round 1 (RS) 6dc into ring.

Round 2 (2dc, 2dc in next st) twice. [8dc]

Round 3 1dc in each st around.

Round 4 Dc2tog 4 times. [4 dc2tog]

Fasten off leaving tail, thread tail onto needle and sew around top to close.

Cut a piece of Yarn B approx. 15cm long, tie secure knot in one end, thread other end onto needle and pull needle through Rosehip from bottom to top so that knot sits at bottom.

Tie two Rosehips tog (use image as guide), then tie securely around hanging Ip of Dog Rose Leaf. Rep for each two Rosehips and one Dog Rose Leaf.

Blocking Leaves

Place Leaf in glue/water mix, squeeze out excess carefully, block to shape and leave to dry. <u>Tip:</u>
Place some cling film on top of your blocking mats to ensure your motifs don't stick.

Assembly

With Yarn B and 3mm hook, ch30, work 1dc in hanging Ip at top of Small Oak Leaf and Large Oak Leaf held tog (with Small Leaf in front and RS facing forward for both), (ch15, 1dc in hanging Ip of next motif) for all motifs in following order: Sweet Chestnut Leaf, Dog Rose Leaf (with Rosehip Berries), Mushroom, Small and Large Oak Leaves tog, until all motifs are attached, ch30, fasten off.

To Finish

Weave in all ends.
