LOVEBIRDS

Gauge/Tension

Tension is not critical for this project, make sure stuffing cannot be seen through fabric.

Measurements

Approximately 15cm tall.

Abbreviations

ø diameter

[] number of sts on a given row

beg beginning

k knit

k2tog knit 2 sts tog to dec by 1 st: insert needle kwise into first 2 sts and knit them tog

kfb knit front and back to inc by 1 st: insert needle kwise into next st; knit as normal but don't slip st from needle, instead bring needle around to back and knit through back Ip of same st

kwise knitwise

p purl

p2tog purl 2 sts tog to dec by 1 st: insert needle

purlwise into first 2 sts and purl them tog (right leaning dec)

rem remaining

rep(s) repeat(s)

RS right side **st(s)** stitch(es)

st st stocking stitch: RS knit, WS purl

tog together **WS** wrong side

Pattern Notes

Birds are worked in st st: unless otherwise indicated, k 'even' rows and p 'odd' rows. One Bird is male and other is female, indicated by different yarn colours used throughout Rows 16-27 of Main Body. You may choose to make two different Birds, or two of either male or female. Use stiff cardboard to strengthen and shape Birds' tails. For placement of Wings, tail and details, use image as guide.

(100% Premium Acrylic (Anti Pilling); 100g/300m)

Yarn A: 1829 Wilnis x 1 ball

Yarn B: 1068 Den Helder x 1 ball

Yarn C: 1019 Texel x 1 ball

Yarn D: 1005 Barneveld x 1 ball

Yarn E: 2018 Pollare x 1 ball

Yarn F: 1724 Helmond x 1 ball Yarn G: 1114 Findhoven x 1 ball

3mm knitting needles

2 pieces 2 x 5cm stiff cardboard

4 pieces 2 x 2cm white felt

4 x ø 5mm black safety eyes (item no. 5633-05-000)

Polyester stuffing

4 pieces 22cm x ø 1mm silver craft wire Round nose pliers

Instructions

MAIN BODY (MAKE 2)

With Yarn A. cast on 9 sts.

Rows 1-3 Beg with a p row, work 3 rows in st st.

Row 4 (RS) Kfb, k7, kfb. [11 sts]

Rows 5-7 Beg with a p row, work 3 rows in st st.

Row 8 Kfb, k9, kfb. [13 sts]

Rows 9-11 Beg with a p row, work 3 rows in st st.

Row 12 Kfb, k11, kfb. [15 sts]

Rows 13-15 Beg with a p row, work 3 rows in st st. Change to Yarn B (for male Bird) or Yarn C (for female Bird).

Row 16 K5, kfb, k3, kfb, k5. [17 sts]

Row 17 Purl.

Row 18 K5, kfb, k5, kfb, k5. [19 sts]

Rows 19-23 Beg with a p row, work 5 rows in st st.

Row 24 K6, (kfb, k1) 4 times, k5. [23 sts]

Rows 25-27 Beg with p row, work 3 rows in st st. Change to Yarn D.

Row 28 K5, (kfb, k2) 5 times, k3. [28 sts]

Rows 29-37 Beg with a p row, work 9 rows in st st.

Row 38 K7, (k2tog, k2) 4 times, k5. [24 sts]

Row 39 Purl.

Row 40 K8. (k2tog, k1) 3 times, k7. [21 sts]

Row 41 Purl.

Change to Yarn E.

Row 42 K8, kfb, k3, kfb, k8. [23 sts]

Row 43 Purl.

Row 44 K7, kfb, k7, kfb, k7. [25 sts]

Rows 45-51 Beg with a p row, work 7 rows in st st.

Row 52 (K1, k2tog) 8 times, k1. [17 sts]

Row 53 Purl.

Row 54 (K2tog) 8 times, k1. [9 sts]



Row 56 (K2tog) 4 times, k1. [5 sts]

Cut yarn and weave end through rem sts, pull tight and fasten off.

RIGHT WING (MAKE 2)

With Yarn A. cast on 7 sts

Row 1 (WS) Purl.

Row 2 (RS) Kfb, k to last st, kfb.

Row 3 Purl.

Rows 4-9 Rep last 2 rows 3 more times. [15 sts]

Rows 10-11 Beg with a k row, work 2 rows in st st.

Row 12 K2tog, k to end.

Row 13 P to last 2 sts, p2tog.

Rows 14-25 Rep last 2 rows 6 more times. [1 st] Cast of rem st and fasten off.

LEFT WING (MAKE 2)

Rows 1-11 Work as for Right Wing.

Row 12 K to last 2 sts, k2tog. [14 sts]

Row 13 P2tog, p to end. [13 sts]

Rows 14-25 Rep last 2 rows 6 more times. [1 st] Cast of rem st and fasten off

SFW RODY

Sew seam of Main Body using mattress st, leaving 3cm gap at centre for stuffing later. Fold cast-on edge flat with back seam at centre and oversew.

Trim cardboard to fit inside Tail of Body and insert.

EYES

Fold two felt squares in half diagonally and make a tiny cut at centre: insert one safety eye through each hole.

Trim felt around safety eyes to make circle.

Attach Eyes to Bird's head, about seven rows above beg of Yarn E section and with 5 sts between them.

IFG (MAKF 4)

Using pliers, bend one piece of wire back and forth to make four claws, each about 1.5cm long. Bend three of the claws towards front and one towards back.

Cover claws in small amount of glue and wind Yarn F around to cover.



Attach to Body

Insert two Legs into Body at seventh row of Yarn B/Yarn C section and with 3 sts between them. Twist excess wire together inside Bird to secure and cut off any excess.

TO FINISH

Stuff Birds, leaving bottom of Tails unstuffed. Close seam opening using mattress st.

With cast-on edge level with head and with short row ends meeting at centre back seam of Bird, sew on Right and Left Wings leaving tip unattached. With Yarn G, embroider beak using several overlapping, vertical straight sts to measure 5 rows high x 3 sts wide from beg of Yarn E section. With Yarn D, work straight sts horizontally across top of beak. Weave in all ends.

METHOD



Dice onion and garlic, add oil to large pan or pot and cook on medium heat till soft.




Chop remaining vegetables, add to pan along with all other ingredients.

Measurements

ø 15.5cm

Pattern Notes

When transferring design to fabric, make sure design is centred and fabric grain is straight (not on the bias). For colour placement, refer to Schematic 1: Embroidery Chart. Embroidery stitch instructions available on Simy's Studio blog: bit.ly/simys-embroidery-tutorial.

Instructions

TRANSFERRING DESIGN

Choose one of two options below or alternative.

- 1) Tape design to window or lightbox, position fabric on top and tape to window or lightbox. Trace design onto fabric using air erasable pen.
- 2) Tape design to window or lightbox, position soluble stabiliser on top and tape to window or lightbox, trace pattern onto stabiliser. Pin stabiliser to fabric.

Clamp fabric into embroidery hoop with traced design facing up and screw tight to secure.

EMBROIDERY

Stems

Using two strands of Bottle Green thread, embroider stems using backstitch.

Leaves

Using two strands of thread and alternating between Sage Green and Green, embroider Leaves using satin stitch.

Roses

Using two strands of thread and alternating between Light Pink, Pink and Hot Pink, embroider Roses using woven wheel stitch.

Weave in all ends under stitches at back of design.

TO FINISH

If using option 2 for Transferring Design, remove fabric from hoop and soak in water to dissolve stabiliser. Clamp fabric into hoop again and let dry.

Trim excess fabric at back of design, leaving 1-2cm.

Cut felt to fit neatly inside embroidery hoop at back of design. Blanket stitch around edge to secure felt to excess fabric (excess fabric now hidden underneath felt).





SHOPPING LIST LOVE² CUSHION

Scheepjes Stone Washed XL

(70% Cotton, 30% Acrylic; 50g/75m)

Yarn A: 860 Rose Quartz x 8 balls

Scheepjes Furry Tales

(100% Polyester; 100g/57m)

Yarn B: 974 Red Riding Hood x 1 ball

8mm crochet hook

5 x ø 30mm buttons (item no. 5708-48-185)

60 x 30cm cushion insert

Gauge/Tension

10 sts and 11 rows to measure 10 x 10cm over dc using an 8mm hook and yarn double stranded.

Measurements

55 x 30cm

Abbreviations

ø diameter

[] number of sts on a given row

ch(s) chain(s) or chain st(s)

ch-sp(s) chain space(s)

dc double crochet

rep repeat

RS right side

st(s) stitch(es)

WS wrong side

Pattern Notes

Cushion is made in one piece using intarsia method to create two furry love hearts. Divide Yarn B into two identical balls as the hearts are made using two separate balls. Colour changes take place on last st of working colour: work last yoh of last dc in new colour and pull through. Carry Yarn A along as you work using Yarn B, trapping it inside sts worked in Yarn B. Yarn B is not carried along Yarn A, but picked up at new row.

Chart Notes

Each square of Stitch Chart 1: Stitch Pattern represents a dc st in indicated colour. Start Stitch Chart at Row 26 and read right to left and



bottom to top. Rep Repeat Section twice and then work 3 sts afterwards. At widest point of heart, there should be 3 dc in-between and 3 dc on both sides

Instructions

With 2 strands of Yarn A. ch56.

Row 1 (WS) 1dc in second ch from hook, 1dc in each ch to end, turn. [55 dc]

Rows 2-25 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), 1dc in each st to end, turn. [55 dc]

Start following Stitch Chart for colour changes.

Rows 26-45 Ch1, 1dc in each st to end. [55 dc] Fasten off Yarn B.


Rows 46-67 Ch1, 1dc in each st to end. [55 dc] **Row 68 (buttonhole row)** Ch1, 5dc, (ch2, skip 2 dc, 9dc) 4 times, ch2, skip 2 dc, 4dc. [55 sts].

Row 69 Ch1, 4dc, (2dc in ch-2 sp, 9dc) 4 times, 2dc in ch-2 sp, 5dc. [55 sts]

Row 70 Ch1, 1dc in each st to end, fasten off.

Stitch Chart 1: Stitch Pattern



TO FINISH

Weave in all ends. With WS facing, fold top and bottom edge to middle with five rows overlapping to create envelope effect, pin in place. Using mattress stitch, sew short edges together. Attach buttons to correspond with buttonholes. Insert cushion insert and fasten buttons.
