Deer Lase pattern

Materials

Scheepjes River Washed

(78% Cotton, 22% Acrylic; 50g/130m) Yarn A 960 Murray x 1 ball Yarn B 946 Mississippi x 1 ball

Scheepjes Stone Washed

(78% Cotton, 22% Acrylic; 50g/130m) Yarn C 820 Rose Quartz x 1 ball Yarn D 801 Moon Stone x 1 ball Yarn E 822 Brown Agate x 1 ball

A scrap of brown cotton yarn for mouth 2.5mm and 3.5mm knitting needles 3.5mm set of double pointed needles Lockable stitch markers Polyester stuffing 2 x Ø 9mm brown safety eyes 1 x Ø 12mm brown soft safety nose 2 x Ø 11mm buttons 30cm x 4mm ribbon

Gauge/tension

The gauge/tension is not critical for this project, although different measurements may result in different yarn/stuffing amounts needed. Keep the stitches tight to prevent the stuffing from showing through the fabric.

Measurements

Approximately 40cm (16in) tall

Pattern Notes

The body parts are **knitted** separately, and then joined, using the photos as a guide.

Cast on using the long tail cast on method. When you are casting off leave long yarn tails for seaming. The eyes are made using the **intarsia method**, at colour changes, twist the yarns at the back of your work to prevent holes.

Tip!

Change the colour of the Deer's underwear and shoes to create a totally different character. You can also leave the ribbon and the shoe strap behind.

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Garments knitting patterns

With just a few stitches, your tiny friends transform into the most **charming** characters. Will they be a daring explorer, a woodland wanderer, or the best-dressed guest at the picnic? The choice is yours!

General notes



All garments are knitted flat back and forth in rows. Cast on using a long tail method.

The **dress** features a **colourwork** section. See the Knitting Chart for the instructions. Each square represents one stitch, read right side (odd numbered) rows from right to left, read wrong side (even numbered) rows from left to right.

Tip!

Make it your own: shorten or lengthen the sleeves, adjust other details, and switch up the colours for even more variety in your animal's wardrobe.

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
